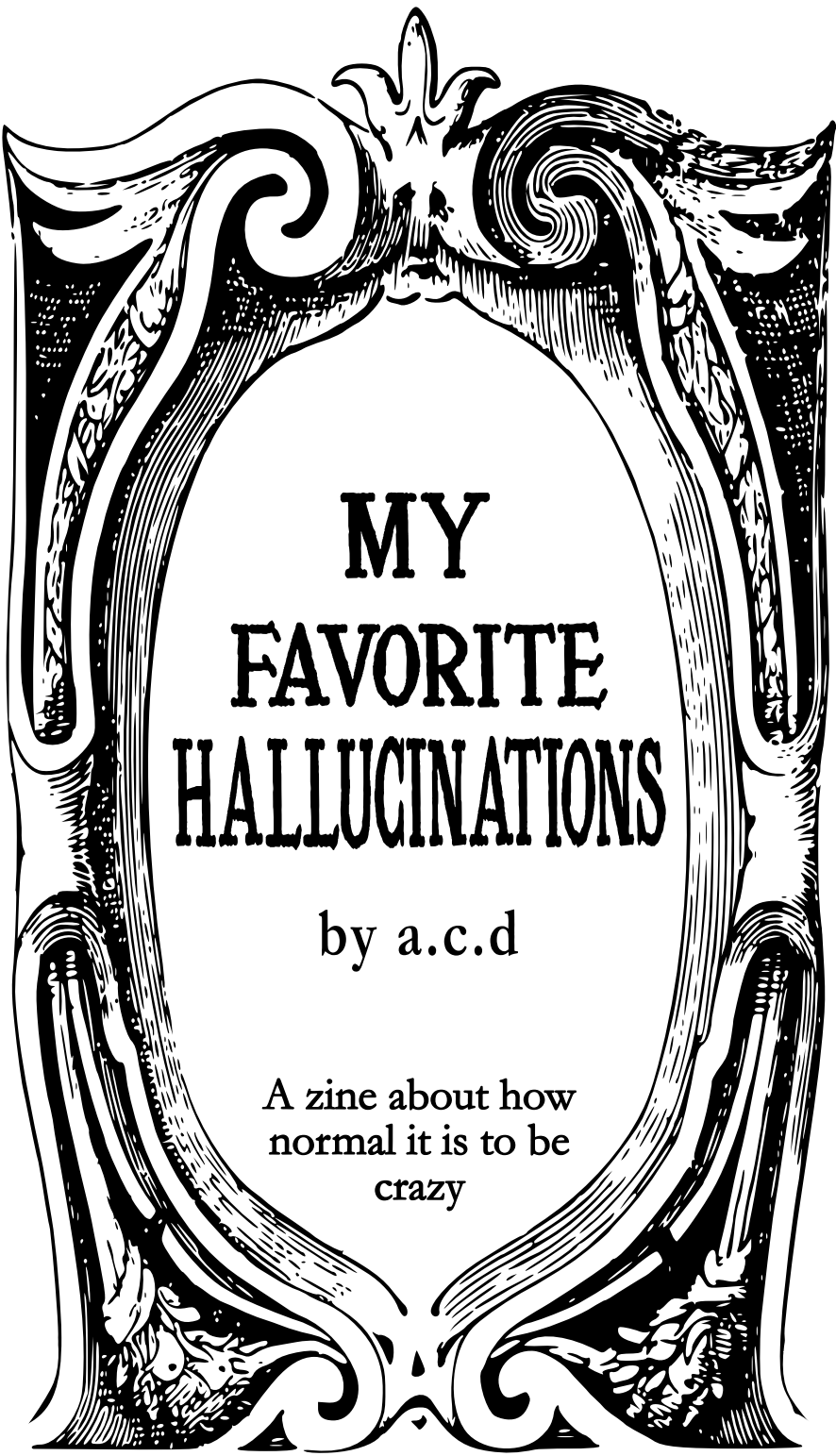
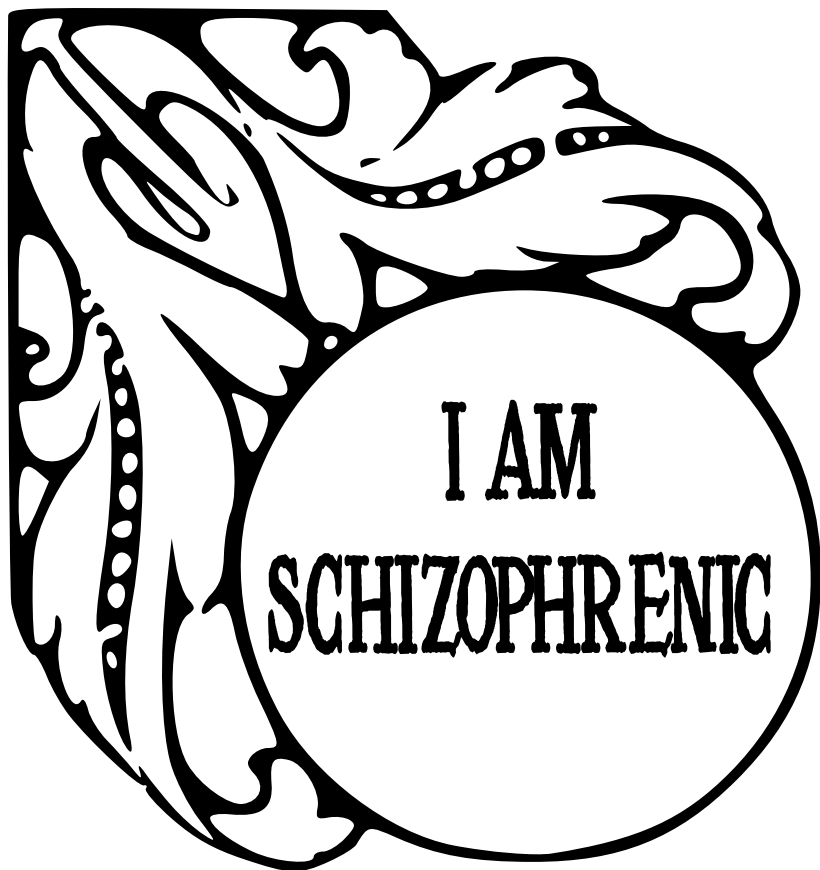




MY FAVORITE HALLUCINATIONS

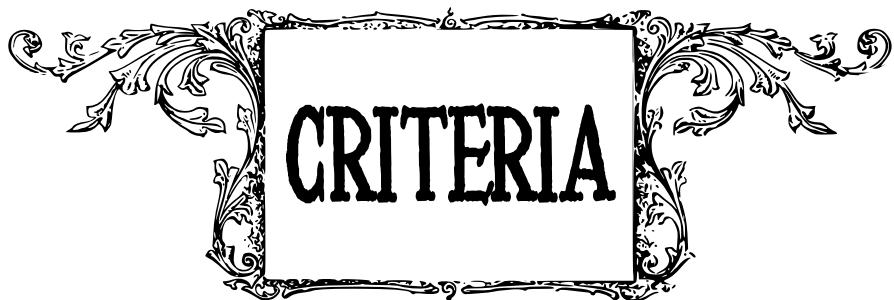

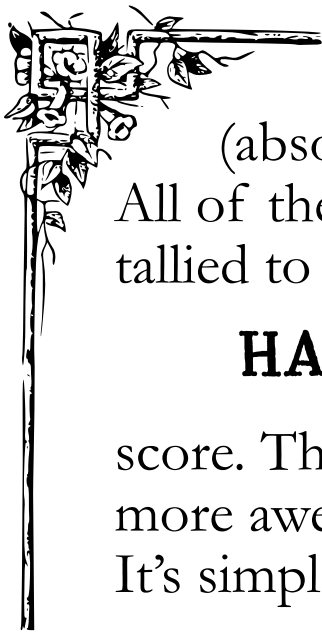

MAGIC: 2

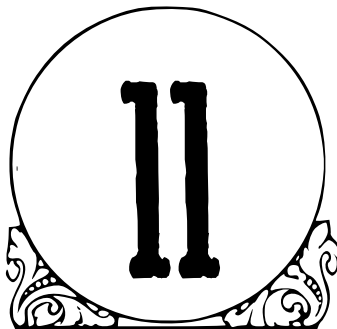
Nothing magical about a brief power outage.

The idea was scary but I knew we would win.

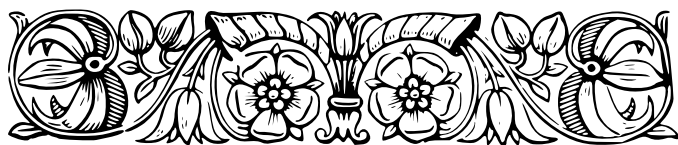
STORYTELLING: 2

MAGIC: 5

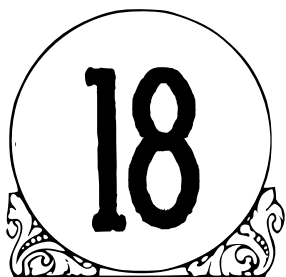
He felt like an entity older and more powerful than I could conceptualize.
